The Invasive Species Management Steward will help reduce the introduction and spread of invasive species throughout the Adirondack Park. The Management Steward conducts invasive species surveys, collects and analyzes data, provides education about invasive species, and manages invasive species at high-use recreation areas such as campgrounds and trailheads throughout the Adirondack region of upstate New York. This is a three-month, full-time, seasonal position for the summer of 2021 that may be extended to six months depending on the availability of funds. The start date is on or about May 3, 2021.

The minimum qualifications including the following background and track record:

- High school diploma or GED and 1 year of experience in land management, or a science related field, or equivalent combination. BA/BS preferred.
- Experience with field data collection techniques.
- Experience working in a team environment.
- Strong verbal and written communications skills.
- Valid drivers' license.
- Multi-lingual skills and multi-cultural or cross-cultural experience appreciated.
