STOP AQUATIC HITCHHIKERS

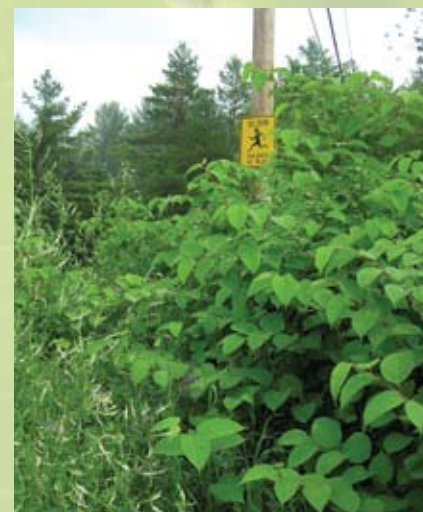
Check, clean, and dry waders,

fish between waterways.



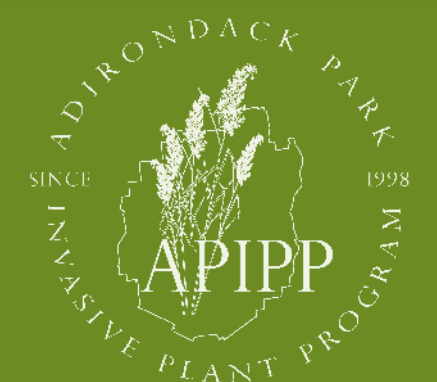
BE PLANTWISE
